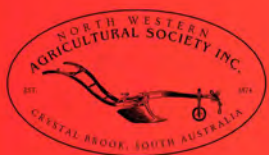

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Welcome to the 145th Crystal Brook Show, after two wonderful shows post Covid we find ourselves in a time of reinvigorating a tradition that has surpassed nearly a century and a half.

This year, 2024, marks the 150th year of our governing organisation, the North-Western Agricultural Society Inc. In 1874, the first Crystal Brook Show was held, a ploughing match to show the finest horses. The show grew from strength to strength and in 1900 the show moved to its current location to be close to the railway line so that patrons could attend the show via train. The show has run every year since its inception in 1874 aside from 1942,1943 and 1944 where the show was abandoned due to World War 2, and in 2020 and 2021, where unfortunately the Covid Pandemic forced the reluctant cancellation of our show.

We are very excited to have the Crystal Brook Young Citizen of the Year and State Netball Representative, Lucas Gulin, open our show in 2024.

This year the committee has endeavoured to act on feedback received and continue to improve the layout and offering available for attendees. This year the Kemmy's Red Brick Trail has been introduced as a low-cost activity for families to explore the show grounds and what is on offer and receive a bag full of goodies in the process. A massive thank you must go to Jodie Bouilly and the entertainment committee for the organisation of this feature and the girl guides for assisting in the sites across the grounds. Other free activities include a massive sand pit treasure hunt, oversized games, Dinkum Dinosaurs and the Petting Zoo. This year will also see the addition of a scarecrow competition.

After last year's show our red tractor mascot was named, there were lots of names put forward but, in the end, a unanimous vote awarded the name of "Kemmy" to our tractor mascot and what a fitting name it is. Kemmy Reid spent an immeasurable number of hours "caretaking" the showgrounds during the late 90's and early 2000's and it was a fitting suggestion that our mascot bear his name.

It is with great sorrow that I acknowledge the passing of past president, life member, advisor and exhibitor Ben Mumford and his son Charlie. Ben was President of our show in 2004-2005 and again in 2010 when a president could not be found. His dedication and countless hours that were put into the show over many years were inspirational. Charlie was an exhibitor from an early age. In their memory a new perpetual trophy will be awarded in 2024.

A show of this magnitude can not go on without the tireless efforts of the organising committee and our secretary, Nat Hodgson. I feel honoured to be part of such a strong and willing team that enthusiastically meet to organise this huge community event. I also must take the time to thank all the show convenors, without you, none of our indoor/ outdoor exhibits are possible. The time and effort you all put into make your sections what they are on show day is amazing and I thank you all.

This day is not possible without all of our kind sponsors, listed throughout the show book. We are grateful for your willingness to contribute and support our local show. Thank you to all the trophy and prize donors, members, exhibitors, judges, stewards and volunteers across the showground. You all play a significant role in bringing this wonderful community event to life.

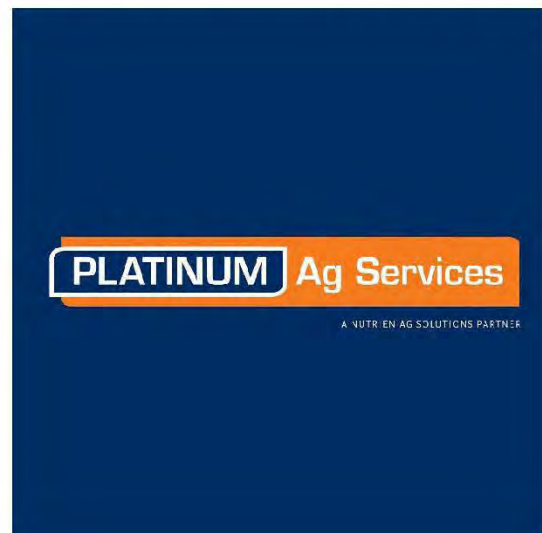

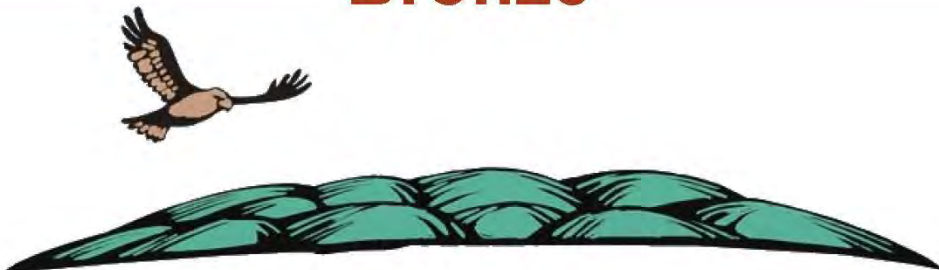

Ben & Charlie Mumford Memorial Trophy

The Mumford Family have been strong supporters of our show for generations dating back to 1934 with Ben's Grandfather, Wally, exhibiting in the Dorset Horn section of the show. His son Ron was President of the show in 1966/67, for the centenary celebration and was awarded life membership for his dedication to the show.

The tradition continued with Ben, who became President in 2004/5 and again in 2010 when a president could not be found. Ben was involved in the relocation of the gymnasium, from the Risdon High School which has continued to be transformed into today's Rec. Centre. He was also part of the committee that demolished and erected the new beef cattle shed and the extension of the shearing shed. Ben became an advisor to the committee after his second term as president and was awarded life membership in 2018. He continued to support the show exhibiting historical machinery, particularly his bulldozers up until 2023. In 2023, he was awarded best pen of 3 lambs in the inaugural prime lamb competition and also exhibited his CAT Dozers in the vintage machinery.

Charlie was involved in our show from a young age where he competed in the Horses in Action section, riding horses with his mother Bronwyn. His love from the show grew through his visits to his Aunt Joan's (Kirchner) house. Where she helped the boys gather up their crafting skills and exhibit in the junior handicrafts and cooking section. Charlie had a passion for agriculture and attended Marcus Oldham College once completing high school.

Tragically, in October 2023, Ben and Charlie passed away in an accident.

This trophy will be awarded at the opening ceremony on Show Day and will rotate through the following sections. The trophy will be awarded to the highest aggregate points as scored in the sections outlined below, aside from vintage machinery where best exhibit will be awarded:

V Beef Cattle (2028)

A Grain and Fodder (2025)

W Led steers (does not include Paraders or Junior Judging) (2029)

S Prime Lamb Competition (2026)

X Horses in Action (2030)

T Wool (2027)

Rural Ambassador and Young Rural Ambassador Awards 2024

This award is conducted by SA Country Shows who will be duly responsible for selecting the state winner during the annual Royal Adelaide Show.

All entrants who enter the award must provide an undertaking that they will abide by the regulations and entry conditions as set out and to abide by the decisions of SA Country Shows.

The rules and regulations apply to all three levels if this award: show society, association, and state levels.

The award will be run by qualification through country shows, to association finals, with a state final being held during the 2024 Royal Adelaide Show.

AIMS:

- To highlight the importance of youth in rural South Australia and in particular the agricultural show movement.
- To identify and encourage enthusiastic, skilful, industrious, and unselfish young people.
- To give young people a forum to express their views through education and experience, and to develop closer links with the primary industries in South Australia.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS: Entrants must:

- Apply for and complete the entry form.
 - Agree to provide a copy of their curriculum vitae (CV) and an introductory letter for show society, association, and state final judging by the required dates.
 - Provide information indicating their reasons for applying for entry together with CV, indicating work experience, community participation and agricultural show involvement.
 - Be a resident of South Australia.
 - Be enthusiastic and knowledgeable about rural life and affairs, and agricultural shows.
 - Be aged between 16 years and under 19 years as of the 1st of May 2024 .
 - As a state finalist, consent for their name and contact details to be available on the SA Country Shows website for show societies should they wish to make contact.
 - If selected as winner of their association, agree to attend the state final conducted during the 2024 Royal Adelaide Show from 1:30 pm on Friday the 31st August (pre-show) to 10:00 pm on Tuesday the 3rd of September 2024 (dates to be confirmed).
 - If selected as state winner of the Rural Ambassador Award, to represent South Australia in the Agricultural Shows Australia National Finals in 2025, date and location to be advised.
- Entrants must wear smart casual clothing suitable for an autumn or spring show

Entries for Young Rural Ambassador are to be submitted to the Secretary by 5th August 2024.

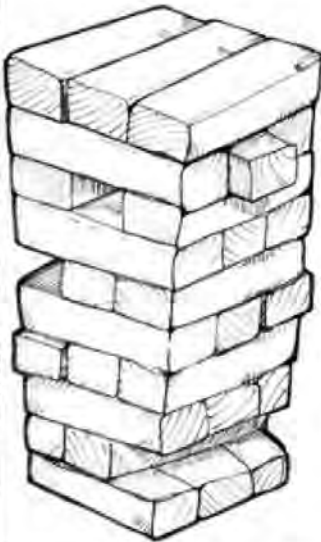

| 250g dark brown sugar | 60g mixed peel |
| 6 eggs | 60g chopped almonds |
| 250g sultanas | 375g plain flour |
| 250g raisins | 1 tsp baking powder |
| 200g currants | 1 tsp mixed spice |
| 100g dates | 200ml sherry or brandy |

Method

Chop fruits, mix together and soak in the sherry or brandy overnight. Sift together flour, baking powder and spice. Cream butter and sugar. Add eggs one at a time, beating well after each addition, then alternately add fruit and flour and lastly chopped nuts. Mix thoroughly. Place mixture in a well prepared tin (square) 19-22cm, and bake in a slow oven for approximately three to three and a half hours.

Hint: Fruit should be cut to the size of currants.

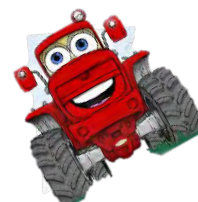

 - g. Breeding traits will not be considered as part of the judging.

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NWAS REGULATIONS

1. A subscriber of \$40 (Family) is entitled to tickets for two adults, three children (5-17 years) and 1 Vehicle.
2. A subscriber of \$30 (Dual) is entitled to tickets for two adults and one vehicle.
3. A subscriber of \$20 (Single) is entitled to tickets for one adult and one vehicle.
4. Junior membership is available for \$5 which provides 1 ticker (5-17 years)
5. All entrants in Section S, V, W, X must be members of the Society. Entry fee will vary from \$1 to \$20. Ute Entry fee \$5.
6. Those entering livestock competitions i.e. Horses, Sheep, Cattle must be financial members on Show Day (Poultry exhibitors exempted)
7. Prices for admission to Show Grounds on day of Show will be: Members and Subscribers free on presentation of tickets, Adults \$15 per day; Concession \$10 per day (on presentation of card) Children 5-17 years of age \$5 per day, Pre-school children free.
8. The President or an Officer appointed by the Society may withdraw an Exhibit from being judged, without any reason being given.
9. As soon as the Judge's decision is given, the name of the Exhibitor may be placed on the exhibit, and if same is for sale, a price may be fixed thereto, or the time specified when it will be sold.
10. No person or persons will be admitted to the Pavilion, Yards, Tents, or Show Ring nor enclosure roped off space while the Articles or Stock are being judged, except one person in charge of Horses, Committee and Judges, the two latter of whom shall wear distinct badges.
11. No Exhibitor or their agent shall have personal communication with the Judges while in the execution of their duties, on it being proved that such communication has been held the Exhibitor may be disqualified. Should any information be required by the Judges, it must be obtained through the Stewards or through the Secretary.
12. Any Exhibitor or attendant with an exhibit giving annoyance to the Judges, or making use of insulting language to the Committee, Judges or Officials, shall be liable to have his exhibits disqualified, and/or be expelled from the grounds.
13. Entries for all exhibits for the Show received by the Secretary or the Society are subject to the approval of the Committee, who may decline to accept such entry without assigning any reason for doing so. Entries for exhibits in all classes are received by the Society only on the express condition that the Exhibitors agree to abide by the decisions of the judges, Stewards or Committee. The decisions and awards made and given are final and not subject to any action at law.
14. Judges are empowered to withhold prizes where exhibits are considered unworthy or considered to be non-bona fide owned by the exhibitor. The Judge's decision to be final.
15. The Public must leave the building at 4.30pm after which time only exhibitors will be admitted for removal of exhibits.
16. **No Stock or other exhibit to be removed until 4.30pm** and exhibit leaving the ground before that time without the permission of the Secretary may be disqualified.
17. No Stock or other exhibit to be sold by auction on the ground unless it has been shown for the competition and not until 4.30pm, and by permission of the sub-committee.
18. All Sideshows, including Pugilistic Shows, will be under the control of the Showmen's Guild of South Australia, under terms and conditions mutually agreed upon. The Society reserves the right to refuse any persons a stand or stall without assigning any reason for doing so.
19. All sideshows must have pegs on tents etc., adequately covered to protect the public.
20. No second-hand Vehicles or Machinery shall be exhibited for sale.
21. The President, Secretary or an appointed Officer of the Society, shall have power to enter and Side-show at any time they wish, free of charge.
22. An area to be decided by the Committee will be allotted to applicants on which to display Machinery, Motors or other Goods. A charge for the first such Block OUTDOORS will be \$100 (8mx6m), \$85 (6mx6m) or \$65 (3mx3m). Four large Machinery OUTDOOR blocks available for \$600. INDOORS (Marquee) will be \$100 per site (3m x 3m), Trade Hall will be \$120 (3m x 3m).
23. Electricity use per outlet \$20.
24. All Cars must be parked where directed by Officials, however minimal onsite parking is available so first in first served will be applied.
25. All prizes will be paid on day of Show either as a Trophy, Cash or goods/voucher.
26. The dates named by closing entries will be strictly adhered to, subscriptions or entry fees must be paid before or when entries are made.

27. Any Exhibitor giving a wrong description of their exhibit with the intentions of deceiving the Society shall render such exhibit or exhibits liable to disqualification, and the prize or prizes (if any) liable to forfeiture, and may be debarred from exhibiting at any future show, and Exhibitors may be requested to make statutory declaration regarding their exhibits if the Committee so desires.
28. Protests in all cases must be in writing, and must be accompanied by a deposit with the Secretary of a sum representing half the value of the Prize (with a maximum amount of \$10.00) awarded by the Judge, and may be forfeited if protest is not upheld. Protests must be lodged, with the Secretary within one hour after judging.
29. No responsibility shall rest on, and no liability shall be incurred by the Society in respect to any event connected with the Show.
30. The Society will not under any circumstances hold itself liable for any accident on the ground or premises.
31. The Society will not under any circumstances hold itself responsible for any loss, damage to, or any miss-delivery of any exhibits, but every reasonable care will be taken of exhibits.
32. Any exhibitor or Attendant refusing to attach the prize card or ribbon to any exhibit to which a prize is awarded and to keep the same on during the show, may be disqualified from again competing. No exhibitor will be allowed to display any Prize-Card or Ribbon on an exhibit, stall or stand, other than those issued by the Society for the current year until the judging of that Section has been completed.
33. All Exhibitors must place their exhibits in the space allotted to them by the Stewards in charge of the Class, and no exhibit or portion of same shall afterwards be removed or substituted, under penalty of disqualification.
34. Exhibitors or their agents must if requested point out to the Stewards their respective exhibits, in order that they may be identified, classified, and numbered according to the Catalogue before being submitted to the Judges.
35. Any prize awarded by the Judge which may be withheld in consequence of a valid protest, may be awarded to the exhibit next in order of merit.
36. Should any exhibit having gained a prize be disqualified, the next in order of merit does not necessarily obtain the prize. The Committee with or without the advice of the Judge shall decide the question.
37. Should there be any reason to suspect that any exhibit is either diseased or dangerous, the Society reserve the right of refusing admittance to or removing the same from the ground at the expense of the Exhibitor.
38. All persons exhibiting shall accept the decision of the Judges appointed by the Society as to the merits of their exhibits, and in the case of protests alleging infringement of the Regulations, the decision of the Committee shall be accepted as final, except on appeal to the North Western Agricultural Societies Association.
39. No entry will be received from any person disqualified by this Society, or by the Northern Agricultural Societies Association during the period of such disqualifications, and should any entry be accidentally accepted, it shall when discovered be deemed void and the entry fee may be forfeited.
40. Any matter not dealt with shall be decided by the Committee concerned, whose decisions shall be final. Five to form a quorum.
41. Cups and Trophies which must be won more than once shall remain in custody of the Society until the winner determined.
42. Any conditions or regulations printed in this prize list under the various Sectional headings are to be construed as part of the regulations governing the conduct of the Show of the Society and equally binding on Exhibitors.
43. All applications for connection to the electricity supply must be approved by the President or his/her nominee.
44. No exhibit having taken a First Prize will be allowed to compete in any other Class, unless otherwise provided for.
45. The Judges are empowered to decide upon the age of any animal exhibit in any class. Age of horse to date from 1st August.
46. No exhibitor will be allowed to make more than three Entries in one class, with the exception of Section M
47. No cheques outstanding over two years will be honoured by the Society.
48. In the event of a tie, the final decision will be awarded on a count-back.
49. Any unauthorized person found on grounds after dark on Friday or Saturday of the Show will be prosecuted.
